



















Starting from the Parish Church of "Vilar de Murteda", turn left, crossing the N305 and climb right after that towards the "Monte do Castro" hill, from where one can enjoy a magnificent view over the town and surrounding hills. Here existed formerly a mining town from the Iron Age. Continue down the other side then turn right, always following the "Caminho de Santiago" Pathway and the PR 22- "Trilho dos Romeiros" (Trail of Pilgrims), with their small shrines, almost until getting to the "Montaria" Parish Council, where you got to turn left. A few meters forward, turn right and keep on going, always practicing forest paths, until the "Asnos" Bridge. After crossing over the bridge, continue until reaching the N305, traveling for a few meters and then turn right. You will reach a stone water pipe in cement that will take you through several water mills, until the "Casal" pathway, where you will turn right and continue to the "Pereiro" waterfall; a paradisiacal place where you can get some rest if you so decide. Along the waterfall can be seen an ancient wood sawing device. The Oaks, chestnut trees and other native trees and fruit ones are from here to become an integral part of the course. From there go ahead a few more meters down the "Veiga" path, then turn left using the "Rodo" path. Scroll through this for some time, cutting then left toward the "Cajusta" mill path, partly following the "Seixo" river, whose "Poço Negro" (Black Pit), another idyllic place, is located just 50 meters from the trail. Along the river and on the other side once existed a ancient stone water pipe going by the name "Rego dos Frades", leading water to the remote monastery of "São Salvador da Torre". Rising up a bit, continue through forest patches to the "Ervideiro" location. Keep foward through cultivated fields until the Parish Church, thus ending the course.
